GRAPE VARIETY

Pinot Noir

COLOUR

Clear, Pale Ruby

NOSE

Ripe red berry and dark fruits with complexing oak spice and whole bunch lift.

PALATE

A complex palate full of rich ripe berry fruits with a bright acid line balanced by the rich tannins and oak

VINEYARD REGION

Tasmania 54.5%, Yarra Valley 45.5%

VINTAGE CONDITIONS

A cool and wet year across both regions, with rain between October and January hampering flowering in some sites. As a result, yields were significantly reduced. Cool ripening period produced wines with lower alcohol and higher acidity with great elegance and concentration.
